

You will have seen the dreadful images of families being forced to continually move from place to place to try to find safety. Several members of Moataz's family have been killed including women and children and the family is currently living on the streets. He says 'We are running and bombs drop on us everywhere. We are in hell. Save us. Help us. Pray for us'.

Please pray that there may be a ceasefire that enables Moataz to buy a new tent and, at least, find a safer place, get some respite, provisions and medicine for his young family.

St John's Fire Drill:

As we did in 2023, we have the next annual St Johns Fire Evacuation Drill coming up in the next few weeks. The alarm will sound during a service and all those present need to leave the church and assemble at one of the two Fire Assembly points in the churchyard. Thank you for your participation in this exercise, whenever it happens.

St John's Church – Relocation of gravestones:

To make space available for future burials in the churchyard, it is proposed to move several gravestones from their current positions to the edge of the churchyard, against either a wall or a fence. All the gravestones to be moved are over 100 years old.



Gospel: John 6.1-21

When the Gospel is announced we respond with:

Glory to you, O Lord

Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming towards him, Jesus said to Philip, 'Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?' He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do.

Philip answered him, 'Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to Jesus, 'There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?' Jesus said, 'Make the people sit down.' Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, 'Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost.' So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, 'This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world.' When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.

When evening came, his disciples went down to the lake, got into a boat, and started across the lake to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. The lake became rough because a strong wind was blowing. When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the lake and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. But he said to them, 'It is I; do not be afraid.' Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land towards which they were going.

At the end the reader will say: This is the Gospel of the Lord The response is: **Praise to you, O Christ**
